

## SPOUSE OF PERMANENT RESIDENT (F-2-3)

### ELIGIBILITY

F-2-3: Spouse of a permanent residence visa holder (F-5)

Every citizen and resident of Mongolia who wants to enter the Republic of Korea with a Spouse of Permanent Resident visa must apply through the Visa Application Centre. Note that you can apply for a single-entry visa, valid for up to 1 year and the Korean Diplomatic mission can ask for additional documents.

### COMMON DOCUMENTS

1. Visa application form (Form 17) and one 3.5x4.5 cm picture taken in the past 6 months
2. Passport in original and a copy (valid at least 6 months from the day of the visa application)
3. Certificate of criminal record (issued within the past 45 days (For first time visitors between 18 and 60))
4. Marriage Certificate  
For minor child, Birth certificate (Copy of the identification cards of the parents if the date of birth of the parents are not on the birth registration certificate)
5. Health certificate (issued within 6 months from the date of visa application)
  - Issued by a hospital-level medical institution or public health center
  - In addition to the general items, mental illness, sexually transmitted diseases, acquired immune deficiency, tuberculosis, etc. should be included.

### INVITER'S DOCUMENTS

1. Invitation Letter in the format provided by the ROK Embassy stamped with the host's seal with the original seal certificate (notarization required)
2. Background Statement for Foreign Spouse (in the format provided by the ROK Embassy)
3. Guarantee letter (in the format provided by the ROK Embassy, Guarantee period: for two years from the date of entry)
4. Copy of the alien registration card (both sides)
5. Proof of marriage document (Documents issued by the national administrative agency for a permanent resident)
6. Financial /Income proof/ documents:
  - Income certificate (National Tax Service), Employment certificate, Account transaction details, Confirmation of Credit information (National Federation of Banks)

\*The total income of the host or the joint income of the host and the immediate family must be at least equivalent to the Gross National Income (GNI) per capita of the past year, announced by the Bank of Korea.

\*In 2021, the GNI per capita was KRW 40,247,000. If the family members are up to 3, the income shall be over 70% of the GNI (KRW 28,172,900).

<p><b>7. Residential requirements proof document</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Certified copy of the real estate register of the host, notarized rental contract of the host (if applicable)</li></ul>
<p><b>8. Criminal record certificate of both parties of the marriage</b></p>
<p><b>9. Health certificate (issued within 6 months from the date of visa application)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Issued by a hospital-level medical institution or public health center</li><li>• In addition to the general items, mental illness, sexually transmitted diseases, acquired immune deficiency, tuberculosis, etc. should be included.</li></ul>
<p><b>10. For inviters with previous marriage records:</b> Divorce status certificate or copy of court decision decree of divorce</p>

**\*Note: The holder of the Permanent Residence Visa (F-5) is eligible as inviter only after three year holding of the F-5 status.**
